


Summer Term 2018 Termly Overview Year Two ~ Elm ~ Global Gardens

<p><u>English</u></p> <p>Throughout the Summer term we will continue to develop our literacy skills but also focus on embedding what we have learnt so far this year. We will use a range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts and adapt them to write our own texts. We will start of the term by studying the fiction book 'Previously' which is a twist on the traditional fairy tales. Later on in the term we link our learning in science and topic to help us write a non-chronological report. We will continue to have a big focus on spellings.</p> <p>During the term, children will take part in guided reading sessions focusing on retrieving key information from texts and meanings of words. Fluency in reading is one of the key aims this term.</p> 	<p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>In daily maths lessons we will develop number recognition skills by counting and working with numbers to 100. We will focus on learning fluently our 2, 5 and 10 times tables and counting in 3s. The children will develop calculation skills and use strategies to tackle problems with addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. They embed our number facts to 20 and 100, including quick recall of number bonds to 10 and 20. We will apply our learning to one and two step problems and develop a key understanding of measuring length and weight, money, time, shape, fractions of numbers, position and movement.</p> 	<p><u>Science</u></p> <p>This term in Science we will continue to focus on plants. We will explore outside and prepare tubs for planting vegetables. We will also continue to observe and investigate differences between seasons. In the second half of the term we will look at mini-beasts and their habitats.</p> 	<p><u>ICT</u></p> <p>In ICT we will be using the web to find things out and have an introduction to computer modelling. In the second half of the term we will be writing and responding with blogs and creating interactive eBooks.</p>	<p><u>Personal, social, and emotional development.</u></p> <p>We will follow the themes of 'Relationships' and 'Changes' throughout the term, exploring and developing our relationships with each other and increasing our independence skills. We will also look at getting ready for changes at the end of the year with them leaving KS1 and becoming members of KS2</p>
<p><u>Art</u></p> <p>Art will be linked to topic work with the children gaining experiences in: colour mixing & painting skills, drawing and sketching, collage & construction. We will develop art techniques using brushstrokes, texture and tone. In the second half of the term we will focus on studying famous art work by Monet.</p>	<p><u>R.E.</u></p> <p>Throughout the summer term we will be focusing on the key question 'What do Christians believe God is like?'</p> <p>As part of answering this question we will identify what a parable is, focusing on the story of the Lost Son from the bible. We will think, talk and ask questions about whether they can learn anything from the story, exploring different ideas. We will be learning about how Christians believe in God and how they find out about God in the bible.</p>	<p><u>Design & Technology</u></p> <p>Design and Technology this term will link to our topic Global Gardens. We will design our own allotments and design bird scarers to protect our plants.</p>	<p><u>P.E.</u></p> <p>The first half of term we will be focusing on striking and fielding where we will develop our throwing and catching skills along with working as part of a team. In the second half of term we will be focusing on athletics in preparation for Sports Day. We will continue to promote the need for a healthy lifestyle.</p> 	<p><u>Homework</u></p> <p>Tasks will include: daily reading, a literacy and numeracy task, weekly spellings. Termly project linked to topic.</p>
